- *Richards 2:* A medicine unit with telemetry, primarily treating individuals after CVA. While on this rotation, the lead-up to, and completion of the Comprehensive Stroke Center Survey was completed.
- Richards 7/Malone Family Tower 5: A medicine unit with telemetry, with a concentration on medical and interventional cardiology. Patient population primarily included individuals with heart failure requiring diuresis, individuals requiring medication support for abnormal heart rhythms, individuals requiring interventions for cardiac issues including permanent pacemakers, ICD, and heart catheterizations and stent placement. A small number of patients seen for pre-surgical work-up for CABG and LVAD.
- *Richards 5*: A medicine unit with telemetry, primarily treating individuals with nephrology and urology needs, including dialysis. This unit also served a large number of trauma patients with complex bracing needs.

While on light duty for a broken bone, I took on the role of managing the tracking of the Inpatient COVID Vaccination Pilot Program. Responsibilities included tracking all patients for admission, discharge, vaccine consent, declination, or contraindication, vaccine administration for first and second doses, and correct, timely documentation for all of the above. I was a member of the team who followed-up with patients to ensure they returned to Magee as outpatients to receive their second dose. In addition to participating in bi-weekly Task Force meetings, I provided a daily summary to the Chief Medical Officer.
